What are ThruLines?

- Show how you may be related to your DNA matches
- Based on information from family trees
 - Ancestry does not change information in the trees
 - Inaccurate info in a tree may lead to inaccurate ThruLines
 - Example: Ancestry might list an adopted parent instead of a biological parent. So it depends on how trees are created.
 - ThruLines are hints. You still have to do genealogy!
- Only you and anyone you've united to review your DNA results can see your ThruLines.

What do ThruLines look like?

- From any page at Ancestry, click the DNA tab and select ThruLines.
- Ancestors from your linked tree will appear at the top of your ThruLines.
- Filters
 - All Ancestors
 - Ancestors with new DNA matches
 - Potential ancestors
 - Ancestors in your linked tree
 - Maternal ancestors
 - Paternal ancestors
- Ancestors in solid line boxes are in your tree
- Ancestors in dotted line boxes are designated as "Potential Ancestors"

How do I set up Thrulines?

- Take an AncestryDNA test
- Opt to see and be seen by your DNA matches >

- Link your family tree to your DNA test > <u>https://support.ancestry.com/s/article/Linking-an-AncestryDNA-Test-to-a-Tree</u>
 - Make sure you are the HOME person in that tree
- Make sure your tree is either public, or private but searchable > <u>https://support.ancestry.com/s/article/Family-Tree-Privacy</u>
- If possible, build your tree back at least 4 generations

How Do I Use Thrulines?

- Select a known ancestor or "Potential Ancestor"
- Select RELATIONSHIP or LIST view
- Review DNA matches and relationships
- Carefully review and analyze trees and records of DNA matches
 - Remember that Thrulines are hints, just like a record hint > you still need to do genealogy!
 - Start with Ancestry Member Trees with the most, and best, records > the more the better!
 - Be wary of Ancestry Member Trees with no records.
 - Reach out to the DNA match for more information.
- Click on the amount of DNA you share with a match to review the likelihood of different relationships.
